CHEUNG KONG AND HSBC JOINTLY PRESENT EXHIBITION ON THE HISTORY AND DEVELOPMENT OF KOWLOON

Cheung Kong and HSBC are proud to jointly announce the opening of 'Kowloon from 1881: A Century of Change' - on view from 15 June to 14 September 2010 - an educational exhibition chronicling the fascinating development of Kowloon through trade.

Held at the 1881 Heritage (the site of the former Marine Police Headquarters) in Tsim Sha Tsui, the exhibition charts the history of Kowloon, focusing on the dramatic development of trade, which transformed the area from a collection of small villages into a large and bustling metropolis.

This century of development is told through HSBC's Asia Pacific Archive collection of documents, artifacts, photographs, videos and other illustrations of Kowloon's landscape, businesses, buildings, people and history.
